
Advent Theme: A Saviour Who Christ The Lord Luke 2:11


Advent is an ancient observance in the Christian church. The earliest advent observance guides appeared in the 500s in what is now France.


This 1st Sunday of Advent generally focuses on the proclamation of the coming of Jesus Christ. The Biblical character most closely associated with this is John the Baptist. We will look at the mission and ministry of John the Baptist.

Malachi 4:1-6 [ESV]

1 "For behold, the day is coming, burning like an oven, when all the arrogant and all evildoers will be stubble. The day that is coming shall set them ablaze, says the LORD of hosts, so that it will leave them neither root nor branch. 2 But for you who fear my name, the sun of righteousness shall rise with healing in its wings. You shall go out leaping like calves from the stall. 3 And you shall tread down the wicked, for they will be ashes under the soles of your feet, on the day when I act, says the LORD of hosts.

Malachi 4:1-6 [ESV]

- 4 "Remember the law of my servant Moses, the statutes and rules that I commanded him at Horeb for all Israel.
- 5 "Behold, I will send you Elijah the prophet before the great and awesome day of the LORD comes. 6 And he will turn the hearts of fathers to their children and the hearts of children to their fathers, lest I come and strike the land with a decree of utter destruction."



John the Baptist was the forerunner of the Messiah and his message was a message of repentance. It was a call to change the direction of our hearts.



Luke 3:7-10 [ESV]

- 7 He said therefore to the crowds that came out to be baptized by him, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? 8 Bear fruits in keeping with repentance. And do not begin to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' For I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children for Abraham. 9 Even now the ax is laid to the root of the trees. Every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire."
- 10 And the crowds asked him, "What then shall we do?"



John the Baptist's ministry began in the 15th year of Tiberius. This was either AD 27 or 28-29. Tiberius was coregent with Augustus for about a year and it is generally viewed that Luke refers to the coregency as the beginning of Tiberius's reign. If so, John was born in 6-5 BC. Nov. 27, 2022



Mark 6:18-24 [ESV]

17 For it was Herod who had sent and seized John and bound him in prison for the sake of Herodias, his brother Philip's wife, because he had married her. 18 For John had been saying to Herod, "It is not lawful for you to have your brother's wife." 19 And Herodias had a grudge against him and wanted to put him to death. But she could not, 20 for Herod feared John, knowing that he was a righteous and holy man, and he kept him safe. When he heard him, he was greatly perplexed, and yet he heard him gladly.

Mark 6:18-24 [ESV]

- 21 But an opportunity came when Herod on his birthday gave a banquet for his nobles and military commanders and the leading men of Galilee. 22 For when Herodias's daughter came in and danced, she pleased Herod and his guests. And the king said to the girl, "Ask me for whatever you wish, and I will give it to you."
- 23 And he vowed to her, "Whatever you ask me, I will give you, up to half of my kingdom."
- 24 And she went out and said to her mother, "For what should I ask?" And she said, "The head of John the Baptist."

Josephus mentions the death of John the Baptist and indicates that in the view of the Jewish people Herod's defeat by the Nabateans in AD 36 was God's judgement for the execution of John.

1 Kings 18:21-24 [ESV]

21 And Elijah came near to all the people and said, "How long will you go limping between two different opinions? If the LORD is God, follow him; but if Baal, then follow him." And the people did not answer him a word. 22 Then Elijah said to the people, "I, even I only, am left a prophet of the LORD, but Baal's prophets are 450 men. 23 Let two bulls be given to us, and let them choose one bull for themselves and cut it in pieces and lay it on the wood, but put no fire to it. And I will prepare the other bull and lay it on the wood and put no fire to

We know a great deal about Herodias the granddaughter of Herod the Great. She was married to her uncle Herod II [Philip] who lived in Rome. She had a daughter by him named Salome. When she was around 40 she divorced Herod II and married Herod Antipas [also an uncle]. Her daughter Salome married her elderly great uncle Philip the Tetrarch [Herod the Great had 2 sons named Philip].

Salome clearly learned to actions and attitudes from her mother that played into later broken relationships. It is not hard to imagine the vicious, brutal and mercenary relationships in the Herod family. When we allow these desires to control our hearts it will be reflected in our relationships.



Luke 1:13-17 [ESV]

13 But the angel said to him, "Do not be afraid, Zechariah, for your prayer has been heard, and your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you shall call his name John. 14 And you will have joy and gladness, and many will rejoice at his birth, 15 for he will be great before the Lord. 

2 Corinthians 5:17-21 [ESV]

17 Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. 18 All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation; 19 that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. 20 Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. 21 For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.


